SUMMARY OF RULES AND PROCEDURES

AGENDA ITEMS: The Commission may reschedule items on the agenda. The Commission will generally hear uncontested matters first, followed by discussions of contested matters, and staff announcements in that order. Anyone who wishes to address the Commission should obtain a form from either the Commission Clerk or from the table located near the entrance of the hearing chamber.

<u>CONDUCT OF HEARINGS</u>: A contested matter is usually heard as follows: (1) discussion of the staff report and the environmental document; (2) testimony of proponent; (3) testimony of opponent; (4) Public Testimony (5) rebuttal by proponent; (6) provision of additional clarification by staff as required; (7) close of the public hearing; (8) Commission discussion and Commission vote.

<u>ADDRESSING THE COMMISSION</u>: Any person who wishes to address the Commission should submit a speaker's request form at the beginning of the meeting; move to the front of the chambers when an item is called; and, when recognized by the chair, state their name, address and affiliation. Please attempt to make your statements concise and to the point. It is most helpful if you can cite facts to support your contentions. Groups of people with similar viewpoints should appoint a spokesperson to represent their views to the Commission. The Commission appreciates your cooperation in this matter.

<u>PUBLIC COMMENT TIME LIMITS</u>: The Sacramento Local Agency Formation Commission welcomes and encourages participation in its meetings. Rules of the Commission provide for the following limitations of discussion: The Commission will hear public comment prior to the consideration of any item. (1) a principal proponent will be allowed a 5-minute statement; (2) other proponents will be allowed a 3-minute statement; (3) opponents are allowed 3-minute statements with the exception of spokespersons for any group who shall be permitted 5-minutes; (4) the principal proponent shall have a 3-minute rebuttal; (5) staff will provide clarification, as required.

<u>VOTING</u>: A quorum consists of four members of the Commission, including any alternate. No action or recommendation of the Commission is valid unless a majority (4 votes) of the entire membership of the Commission concurs therein.

<u>OFF AGENDA ITEMS</u>: Matters under the jurisdiction of the Commission, and not on the posted agenda, may be addressed by the general public under "Public Comment From the Floor" on the Agenda. The Commission limits testimony on matters not on the agenda to three minutes per person and not more than fifteen minutes for a particular subject. The Commission cannot take action on any unscheduled items.

<u>SPECIAL NEEDS</u>: Meeting facilities are accessible to persons with disabilities. Requests for assistive listening devices or other considerations should be made 48 hours in advance through the Commission Clerk at (916)874-6458.

AB 745 DISCLOSURES: The Political Reform Act requires all interested parties to disclose contributions and expenditures for "political purposes" related to proposals for changes of organization or reorganization (annexations, incorporations, etc.,) as well as contributions and expenditures in connection with Conducting Authority protest proceedings. Such contributions and expenditures must be reported to LAFCo's Executive Officer to the same extent, and subject to the same requirements, as local initiative measures under the Political Reform Act. BACKGROUND

This memo is part of the ongoing effort to keep your Commission informed regarding various legislative matters.

Friday, February 22, is the deadline for introducing new legislation for 2013, the first year of a two-year session. The exception is Committee bills which can be introduced through March. While bills can be amended or "gut and amended" throughout the session until August, currently there is a fairly clear understanding of proposed legislation.

An ad-hoc committee appointed by the CALAFCO Board of Directors will consider and adopt positions on several bills, which staff will report back on.

SUMMARY

There are several pieces of CALAFCO proposed legislation that may be of interest to your Commission.

Omnibus Proposals:

1. Independent Special District Commissioner Definition

A proposal to rewrite the GC section relating to the appointment of the "Independent Special District Commissioner and Alternate Commissioner" by the Special District Selection Committee. The intent is to clarify that the nominated and elected

commissioners are to be members of the legislative body of an independent special district.

Revise GC section 56332 (d) to read:

56332 (d) The selection committee shall appoint two regular members and one alternate member to the commission. The members so appointed shall be elected or appointed members of the legislative body of an independent special district officers residing within the county but shall not be members of the legislative body of a city or county. If one of the regular district members is absent from a commission meeting or disqualifies himself or herself from participating in a meeting, the alternate district member may serve and vote in place of the regular district member for that meeting. The Service on the commission representation by a regular district member who is a special district officer shall not disqualify, or be cause for disqualification of, the member from acting on a proposals affecting the special district

on whose legislative body the member serves. The special district selection committee may, at the time it appoints a member or alternate, provide that the member or alternate is disqualified from voting on proposals affecting the district on whose legislative body the

member serves of which the member is a representative.

2. Independent Special District Definition

Amend (replace) the definition of "Independent district" or "Independent special district" in GC section 56044 with the prior definition from 2010 due to an unintended confusion between the revised definition of "dependent district" created in the 2011 change. No functional or policy change is proposed by this substitution and the result is intended to be a more concise delineation of the differences for purposes of the C-K-H Act.

56044. "Independent district" or "independent special district" includes any special district having a legislative body all of whose members are elected by registered voters or landowners within the district, or whose members are appointed to fixed terms. "Independent special district" does not include any district excluded from the

definition of district contained in Sections 56036 and 56036.6. "Independent district" or "independent special district" includes any special district having a legislative body all of whose members are elected by registered voters or landowners within the district, or whose members are appointed to fixed terms, and excludes any special district having a legislative body consisting, in whole or in part, of ex officio members who are officers of a county or another local agency or who are appointees of those officers other than those who are appointed to fixed terms. "Independent special district" does not include any district excluded from the definition of district contained in Section 56036 or 56036.6.

3. Registered Voter District Wording

In GC sections §56866(a) and §56870, correct a typo wording for "resident voter district" that should read "registered voter district" to be correct.

4. Protest Provision Reference

Correct an oversight in the revision of protest provision sections that missed changing a reference in GC section §57118(f) to reference §57077.4(b) rather than §57114.

5. Santa Clara County Annexations

Amend GC section §56757. §56757 allows certain proposals that include annexations to cities in Santa Clara County to be reviewed and approved by the city, rather than by LAFCO, if the annexation is within the urban service area of the city and the annexation is initiated by resolution of the legislative body of the city. However, the text in section §56757 refers specifically to reorganizations. Not all city annexations in Santa Clara County involve district actions, some of them are city annexations without corresponding district detachments. The proposed text revisions clarify that this provision applies to city annexations and reorganizations involving city annexations. Because the proposed text revisions are consistent with the intent of the law and reflect actual practice in Santa Clara County, it is recommended that these revisions be included in CALAFCO's Omnibus bill.

6. AB 912 Re-Write

Dissolutions with Concurrent Annexation GC §57077.1(c) In 2011, AB 912 streamlined the dissolution process for a district if the district was recommended for dissolution in a prior LAFCo action and if it met certain other criteria. However, that provision only covers a district dissolution process and does not cover a situation where the territory of a dissolved district is concurrently annexed to another district. This proposal addresses that.

7. Reduce Public Protest Period in LA County

Delete Government Code Section 57026(f)(2). GC Section 57026(f)(2) is a special provision which applies only to cities with more than 100,000 in counties of more than 4 million. Los Angeles is the only county in the State with a population of more than 4 million. The next closest counties by population are Orange and San Diego, each with a population slightly over 3 million. There are 14 cities in Los Angeles County with a population of more than 100,000. For the cities in question, this code section requires that the resolution approving a change of organization or reorganization must set a protest hearing that is at least 90 days, but not more than 105 days, after the Commission approves the resolution.

LA LAFCo's practice is to set protest hearings at least 30 days after the public hearing. This allows for a concurrent tolling of the reconsideration period. In effect, for those cities in Los Angeles County that have a population of more than 100,000, the protest period is 3 times longer than usual. LA LAFCo sees no current public policy purpose that is advanced by GC Section 57026(f)(2). This section was enacted years ago when multiple annexations were occurring in the northern area of the county. Most cities perform extensive outreach before proposing to annex unincorporated territory into their

city. For this reason, most of their city annexation proposals experience either no protest, or merely a handful. For two recent annexations—one in excess of 5,000 people, and one in excess of 10,000 people—LA LAFCo received a grand total of 4 written protests. LA LAFCo sees no opposition from any of the 14 cities.

8. Landowner Definition

Clarifying the definition of "landowner" in GC Section §56048. *Text attached*. Regular Legislative Proposals:

9. Expand Protest Exemption for Island Annexations

In 2004 the Legislature approved legislation (GC sections 56375.3 and 56375.4) to allow for cities to propose to annex islands of unincorporated territory up to 150 acres in size without the need for costly protests or elections in order to implement logical and efficient jurisdictional boundaries. A "sunset provision" of January 1, 2014 was included in the legislation. It is proposed to eliminate the sunset provision and increase the island eligibility size to 300 acres. Inconsistent development of urban type services and annexations to cities resulted in many relatively small areas in "islands" or pockets of often underserved properties in county areas substantially surrounded by city(s).

10. Adjust MSR/SOI Timeline

It is proposed to conduct in-depth service reviews over a longer time period and then do so at the LAFCo's discretion, when either a sphere change is merited and if an agency has the potential to contribute to sprawl. Many special districts, such as those providing resource conservation, library, health care, pest control, and cemetery services, do not generally contribute to sprawl. Their boundaries and spheres do not change often. Throughout the state, cities and counties have established urban growth boundaries (UGB) which limit their growth over 20-25-year periods; often spheres and the UGBs are coterminous. At this time, with LAFCo's likely having completed at least one cycle of MSRs/SOI updates, it would be more advantageous for each LAFCO to be able to determine whether it needs to review specific agencies based on its own experience. It would also make sense to coordinate the cycle to be more in line with timing of when counties and cities do their Housing and General Plan updates which is in timeline of 2013 – 2015.

In considering spheres of agencies under LAFCO jurisdiction and in coordination with those agencies, LAFCo's may determine that no change to a sphere is necessary. LAFCo's should have authority by statute to confirm a sphere as it exists, without having to conduct a municipal service review. This would also lower costs of the Commission and, by extension, costs of funding agencies and costs of local agencies. Having a specific time period built into the statute, however, should be a signal to LAFCo's that this responsibility for review of spheres is important and should not be ignored.

11. Service Extension Outside Boundaries (Pending Before CALAFCO Board)

Amend Government Code §56133 and its provisions governing LAFCo approval for cities and districts to provide new and extended services outside boundaries. Three key changes underlie this proposal. The first and most significant change expands LAFCo's existing authority to approve new and extended services beyond agencies' spheres of influence irrespective of public health and safety threats, so long as LAFCo can make three findings at noticed public hearings. These findings involve determining the extension: 1) was contemplated in a municipal service review; 2) will not result in adverse impacts on open-space and agricultural lands or growth; and 3) a later change of organization is not expected or desired based on local policies. The second change clarifies LAFCo's sole authority in determining the application of the statute. The third change deemphasizes the approval of contracts and emphasizes the approval of service extensions.

Municipal Service Review - Report Back (LAFC 07-10)

RECOMMENDATION

Receive and file status report.

Overall the District continues to provide adequate water service to the community and progress is being made to address the water supply and water quality issues. However, the overall financial condition continues to remain weak and the District continues to operate in the red. In addition, the District is not able to obtain liability coverage for employment practices.

DISCUSSION

This report summarizes the actions, developments, and events related to the Rio Linda Elverta Community Water District that have occurred since December 5, 2012.

I. Board of Directors

Four new Board members took office on December 7, 2012. On January 5, 2013, the Board conducted a special meeting and workshop. This meeting included a Strategic Planning Workshop to discuss deferred maintenance, capital improvement projects and district financing.

On January 5, 2013, the Board increased rates previously approved but not implemented. The motion carried 5-0-0. However, the Board suspended the collection of the Standby

fee that was recently approved. Staff was directed to provide additional information and report back to the Board.

It appears that the new Board is attempting to take positive actions to improve Board meetings and develop a long term financial and operational strategy for the District.

II. Progress of Well and Pipeline Construction

Well No. 15

Well No. 15 is operational and can produce approximately 2,800 gpm. This well remains operational however, adjustments and modifications to the chlorination equipment have been required.

Well No. 14

The District has completed drilling the test well. The California Department of Water Resources has taken water samples to determine the water quality. This well contains arsenic and cannot be used without treatment.

CDPH has indicated that a reservoir tank may be the more appropriate option in-lieu of drilling another well. The District and CDPH are updating a water demand study to determine the water supply deficit. A number of factors may have changed from the previous analysis such as the current number of vacancies and the change in the estimated growth rate of the community. The District continues to work with CDPH to finalize the next phase of construction.

Well No. 3 Reactivation Project

CDPH approved the Water Supply Amendment Request for Well No. 3. The Well has been changed from inactive to active. A new variable speed chemical feed pump needs to be installed. The pump has been ordered and delivery is expected in early December. The well should be operational after the new pump is installed and tested. This Well is expected to produce 600 gpm. Adjustments and modifications to the chlorination equipment are still underway.

Well No. 5 Elverta Booster Station Pipeline Replacement Project

Funding for the pipeline has been added to the State Revolving Loan and Capital Improvement Program. This pipeline and booster station is needed to address low water pressure issues for a remote portion of the District service area. Additional engineering studies are being conducted to determine the most cost effective solution to correct the low pressure to this area. CDPH has requested that the funding request for this project be removed from the Scope of Work for State Revolving Funds. The District is therefore amending its supplemental request related to the State Revolving Loan. Therefore, this project will have to be funded from the District's General Fund or Reserve account.

Hydro-pneumatic Tank Evaluation

Recently, the District was notified that it is required to test and evaluate tanks for safety purposes. The District is developing a cost estimate for this test program. This project was not included in the current year budget. On December 17, 2012, the Board agreed to test and evaluate each tank for a total cost of \$2,250. After testing is complete, staff will provide the Board with the evaluation and cost, if any, to make required repairs.

Overall Operations

The District is improving its ability to remotely monitor wells using telemetry equipment.

Urban Water Management Plan

On December 17, 2012, the Board adopted the District's Urban Water Management Plan.

Status of CDPH Compliance Orders

The water quality and quantity continue to be satisfactory. Water pressure is subject to variation because of leaks and equipment failures. However, generally, water pressures remain adequate and comply with CDPH standards.

The District has satisfied one of the Compliance Orders issued by the CDPH related to reporting requirements and staffing plans. The first Compliance Order related to water supply and capacity has not been satisfied because well construction is not complete.

Progress is being made to address the District's water supply issues; however, it appears that the financial and litigation concerns currently are the more significant issues.

III. Sacramento Suburban Water District Interconnection

No changes in the operation or status of the intertie with Sacramento Suburban Water District. RLECWD and Sacramento Suburban Water District renewed this Agreement during March, 2012. This intertie operates only if water pressure drops below 30 psi.

IV. Status of District Operations

District Financial Condition

No significant changes in the overall financial situation of the District. Cash Flow remains tight. Accounts Payables <u>are not</u> current and the District is operating at a loss or in the "red" for last several months. The financial condition of the District is not improving and is actually beginning to erode at an increasing rate. The General Manager has estimated that the operating fund balance is currently \$100,000 in the red.

The District has been able to pay creditors and vendors because it is basically using money that should be deposited into capital and debt service accounts. In addition, over the last several years, the District did not deposit capital construction and debt service funds into the appropriate accounts. Currently, the District needs to put in approximately \$150,000. The District is proposing to repay these funds over a five-year period with annual payments of approximately \$30,000.

Legal costs are exceeding the annual budget amount and may increase as pending litigation goes to trial if settlements cannot be reached. The District acknowledges that it cannot control its legal expenses. Also, the District is not able to terminate the contract without significant costs based on the severance clause. The contract cannot be terminated until June 30, 2014. Also, the contract provides that it will automatically renew under the same terms and conditions unless terminated with a minimum 60 days written notice.

The District Attorney's Office has returned financial records from previous years. Also, the District is making progress to address this year's and previous year's audit findings. A summary is attached to this report. The financial records from the District Attorney's Office will be useful in addressing some of the Auditor Findings.

Operating expenditures except for legal expenses are under budget for the current fiscal year.

Staffing and Employee Relations

No significant issues to report.

Liability Insurance

At the December, 2012 ACWA meeting, ACWA extended the District's liability coverage for a 6 month period; however, this amended policy does not cover "employment practices". The District has not been able to get coverage for this exclusion. The General Manager has contacted ten (10) carriers. This continues to be a significant issue.

District Operations

The General Manager's report for December 8, 2012 to January 8, 2013 is attached highlighting the status of various district operations.

Elverta Specific Plan Development Project

Currently, the CDPH has imposed a building moratorium until the District has complied with the outstanding Compliance Order. The developer for the Elverta Specific Plan area is currently working with the Army Corps of engineers to obtain wetland permits in order

to get approval to construct on approximately 583 acres. The District has also met with the developer to discuss construction of approximately 2,400 new homes and the requirements for infrastructure and a service plan to serve the proposed development. However, prior to construction, CHDP will have to lift the building moratorium. Therefore, it is becoming increasingly crucial that the District complete the wells and/or tank so that building permits can be issued.

Pending Litigation as of January 14, 2013

Currently, the pending litigation is set forth as follows:

Managers Report

December 8, 2012 to January 8, 2013

On December 11, 2012 I walked well site #15 and determined the final punch list items with the contractor, field inspector, lead operator and Engineers from Affinity and Dominichelli & Assoc.

On December 12, 2012 there was a mandatory settlement conference on the Sherrill case. This conference was several hours with the end result being another settlement conference should be held at a future date.

On December 13, 2012 the bimonthly SGA meeting was held the 2012 audit was presented, they elected new officers and there was an update on the groundwater management program.

On December 15, 2012 The District yard was broken into late in the evening. They cleaned out all of the tools from the trucks and all copper and brass that had been removed from repairs that was on the Vactor truck. There were also a couple of large tools that were taken but recovered on the bike trail as they had our name all over them and could not be sold. Staff has been instructed to keep all vehicles and tools locked up after hours.

On December 19, 2012 I was interviewed by CBS news regarding our standby fee to inactive customers. They have made several inquires since that date and are waiting for the Board's final decision on the fees before deciding if they will air the story.

On December 20, 2012 the monthly SAWWA meeting was held we had a presentation on the new Water Efficiency Program that RWA is providing this year along with a presentation by a speaker on public outreach needs of public agencies.

On January 2, 2013 the District yard was broken into again they took small hand tools off of the Vactor truck and broke into the side door of the garage. Only a weedwacker was taken from the garage which was later recovered on the bike path. I have requested the security camera company come and review the poor visibility of the cameras.

On January 3, 2013 there was a mandatory settlement conference regarding the Sherrill cases which lasted most of the Day.

On January 4, 2013 Heidi form Richardson and Co. came to look through the boxes of information returned by the District Attorney to find additional information for their bank audit. She will be returning again on the 11th of this month. The finance committee met to discuss the standby fee Resolution and the financial reports that will be provided at future meetings of the Board.

On January 7, 2013 I had a telephone conference with Richard Hinrichs District Engineer for CDPH regarding our newest amended engineering report. He had concern that the tanks estimated cost was so high that there was not enough money to complete the pipeline that is now included in the project. I am gathering additional information for him regarding this issue. Later that evening there was a finance committee meeting to review the month's expenditures and reports.

On January 8, 2013 I met with California Rural Water Assoc. Region One and reviewed software that would streamline operations. This streamlining includes Consumer Confidence report information, lab testing information, backflow preventer testing information, inventory and other items.

Later that day I met with Jim Crowley, Jim Carson the planning committee and the Elverta Specific Group regarding their interest in moving forward with phase 1 of their project. This would include approximately 2400 homes in the area. It was determined that a review of past water system design work would have to be done due to new regulations regarding water supply. A proposed scope of work along with a 3rd party agreement will be presented at the next meeting of the Board. This will be reviewed by District Counsel before the meeting. I also met with our security camera company to determine why the cameras do not work well at night and a fence contractor to make permanent repairs to the fence. I received a bid for replacing the door that was damaged during the January 2, 2013 break in. I will be looking for other bids on this project.

Project Description

The project consists of annexing the existing four +/- acre parcel, including the recycling facility, into the service territory of the Sacramento Area Service District. The site is currently served by SASD, and during the course of entitlement proceedings with the City of Sacramento it was determined that the parcel is not within the SASD boundary. The City Special Use Permit for

Capital City Recycling, Inc. was conditionally approved, with the requirement that the affected territory satisfy the concerns raised by SASD, as discussed below.

Background

On December 9, 2010, the City of Sacramento Zoning Administrator approved with conditions a Special Permit to establish a new minor recycling facility on a portion of the subject site (Z10-138). The subject site was previously developed with three structures, which includes the subject 15,600 square-foot recycling facility, a 7,980 square-foot office/warehouse building and a 4,920 square-foot modular office building; the latter two buildings are not part of the recycling operation. The site contains paved parking lot areas and landscape planters.

Subsequently, on July 12, 2012 the Zoning Administrator **approved with conditions** a Special Permit Modification (Z11-138) to allow the expansion of the operation of an existing minor recycling facility into the northwest corner on a portion of a 3.89 acre property in the Light Industrial Review (M-1(S)-R) zone for the project - Capital City Recycling Site Modification. The SASD service boundary oversight was identified during that entitlement review.

The affected territory is already within the service boundary of the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District (SRCSD.)

LAFCo Policy, County General Plan, and Zoning Consistency:

The proposal is consistent with your LAFCo Policies, Standards and Procedures. The land uses are consistent with both the City of Sacramento General Plan and zoning. This project is also consistent with the SASD policy that sewer service will only be provided to parcels that are zoned for urban development in accordance with the terms and conditions of the District.

100 Percent Consent

Registered Voters: None/Uninhabited

Property Owner Consent: 100 percent

Staff recommends that the Conducting Authority protest proceedings be waived. The affected territory is owned solely by the landlord of the project proponent. The adjacent neighborhood associations, affected property owners, and landowners within a 500 foot radius of the project site, have been notified of the date, time and place of the hearing on this proposal. The affected territory is deemed to be uninhabited, as there are fewer than 12 registered voters. No public or agency protest has been received.

Affected Agency:

The project was circulated for the review and comment of the Sacramento Area Sewer District, as the affected agency. The site has been served by SASD since 1990. It is unclear why, but the affected territory was never included within the SASD service area. This anomaly is not without precedent. As mapping technology improves, SASD continuously endeavors to align its service boundary with SASD billing records. (Note: your staff also consults regularly with SASD staff in their efforts.)

The affected territory is within the SRCSD service area. During the recent City Special Use Permit Modification review process, SASD requested that in the event of project approval, the affected territory either provide proof of a service by contract arrangement, or annex into the District.

SASD has analyzed the expected demands and impact on the District. SASD has the means and capacity to provide sanitary sewer service with no adverse impacts to existing SASD customers. Although the City of Sacramento also provides sanitary sewer service, it has no proximate facilities, and does not object to the annexation.

Both SRCSD and SASD Master Plans have provisions for providing sanitary sewer service to the affected territory.

Sewer service shall continue to be provided by SASD infrastructure to the existing sewer service lateral. Required modifications, if any, shall be to the satisfaction of the SASD. SASD Design Standards apply to any sewer modification.

Infrastructure/ Fees and Charges

Service to the development within the affected territory will be subject to the standards, ordinances, and mitigation fees established by the District, reducing any potential impacts to existing ratepayers to less than significant.

Property Tax Exchange Agreement

No Property Tax Exchange Agreement is required for this annexation.

LAFCo CEQA Findings

The Capital City Recycling, Inc. operations are ongoing subject to a Special Use Permit conditionally approved by the City of Sacramento. The nature of the operations will not change with the implementation of the annexation. Facilities on the site are fully constructed with water supply and sanitary sewer lines. No additional construction or development will result as a consequence of the proposed project. No activities are proposed that would have a potentially significant effect on the environment. Therefore, the proposed project, consisting of an annexation to the SASD is exempt from the provisions of CEQA, per Section 15301(b) which consists of the operation of existing facilities used to provide... sewerage, or other public utility services.

Based on the foregoing, it is recommended that your Commission direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk Recorder.

Other Affected Agencies

The project was circulated for the review and comment of the City of Sacramento and SRCSD No objections were raised.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER COMMENTS:

The proposal is consistent with the Sacramento City General Plan, the Master Services Elements of the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District (SRCSD) and Sacramento Area Sewer District (SASD) and your Commission's Local Policies, Standards, and Procedures. I respectfully recommend that your Commission:

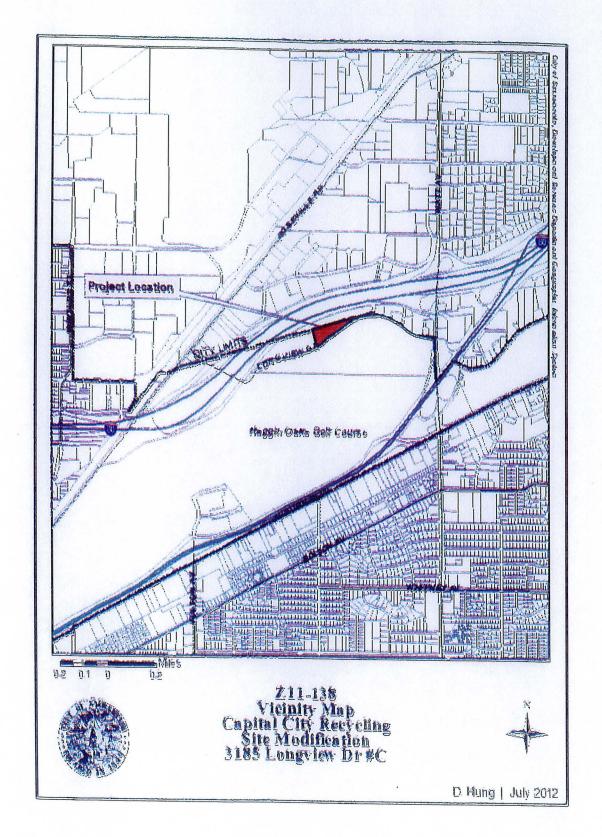

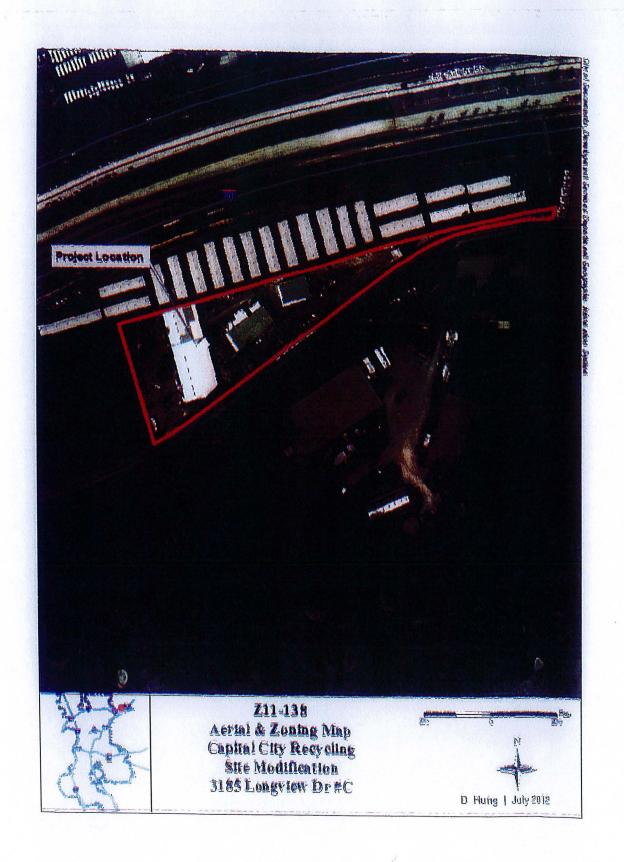

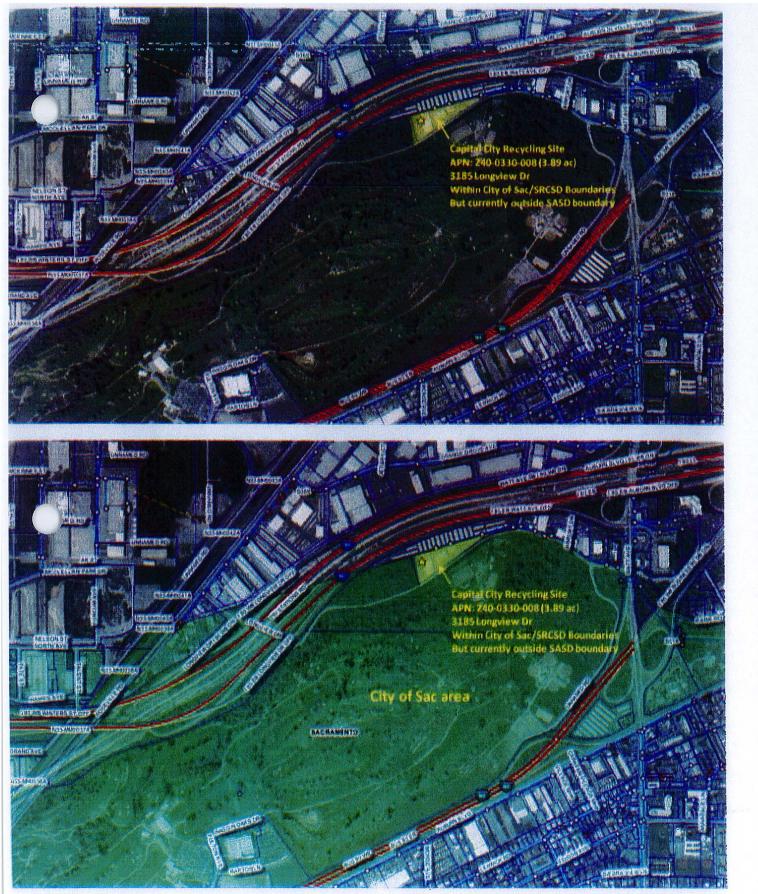

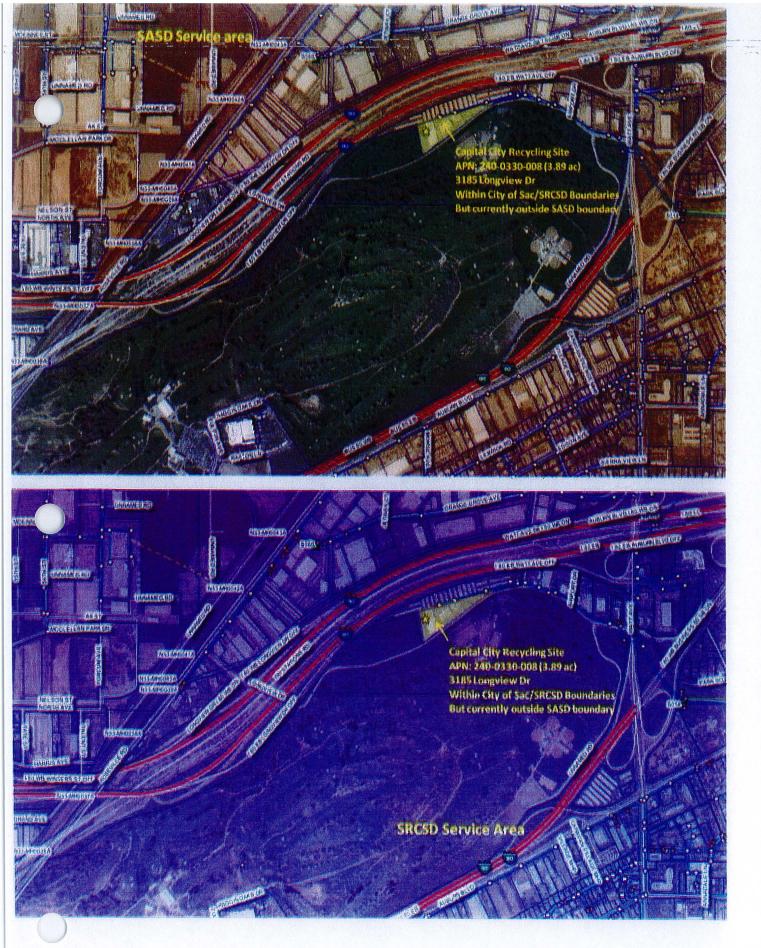


Aerial Map

RECOMMENDATION

I respectfully recommend confirmation of all seven nominations to this Committee.

BACKGROUND

The Special District Advisory Committee (SDAC) was established by our Commission on October 1, 2003. The SDAC consists of a minimum of nine, but no more than seventeen, committee members, including the Alternate, and two Special District Commissioners.

It is the intent of our Commission to have a diverse representation of Special Districts on the committee. The committee includes representatives from recreation and parks, fire, water, flood control/reclamation, and other types of Special Districts (SMUD, Resource Conservation, CSD, etc.)

Nominees must sit as current Board members on a Special District in Sacramento County, and must be nominated by their respective Board. Committee members will serve with no LAFCo compensation. Each committee member will serve a two-year term. Terms are staggered over a period of two years. Committee members are selected by the SDAC Nominating Committee, and must be confirmed by your Commission.

Information sharing is among the most valued elements of the SDAC. Accomplishments of the SDAC include:

- development of the Bylaws of the Advisory Committee;
- formulation of an equitable cost sharing formula for the Special District share of funding for the Commission:
- enhanced criteria for Special District representation during city-county property tax exchange agreement negotiations; and
- streamlining of the Special District Commission member selection process.
